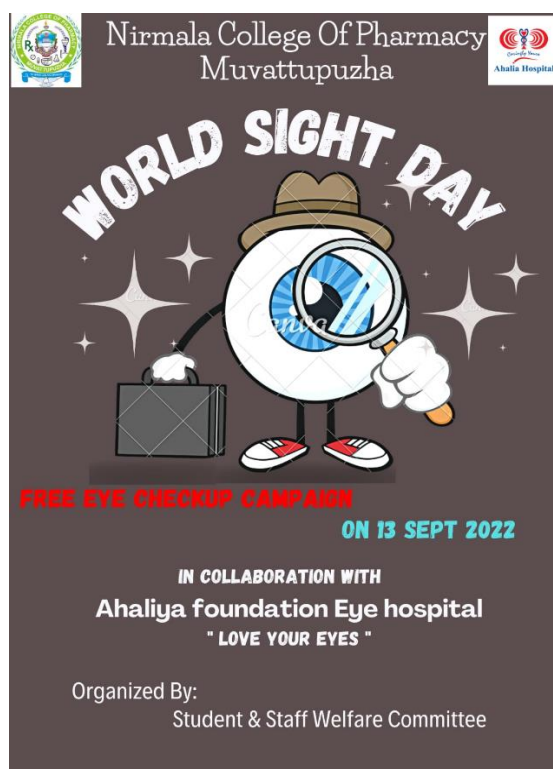

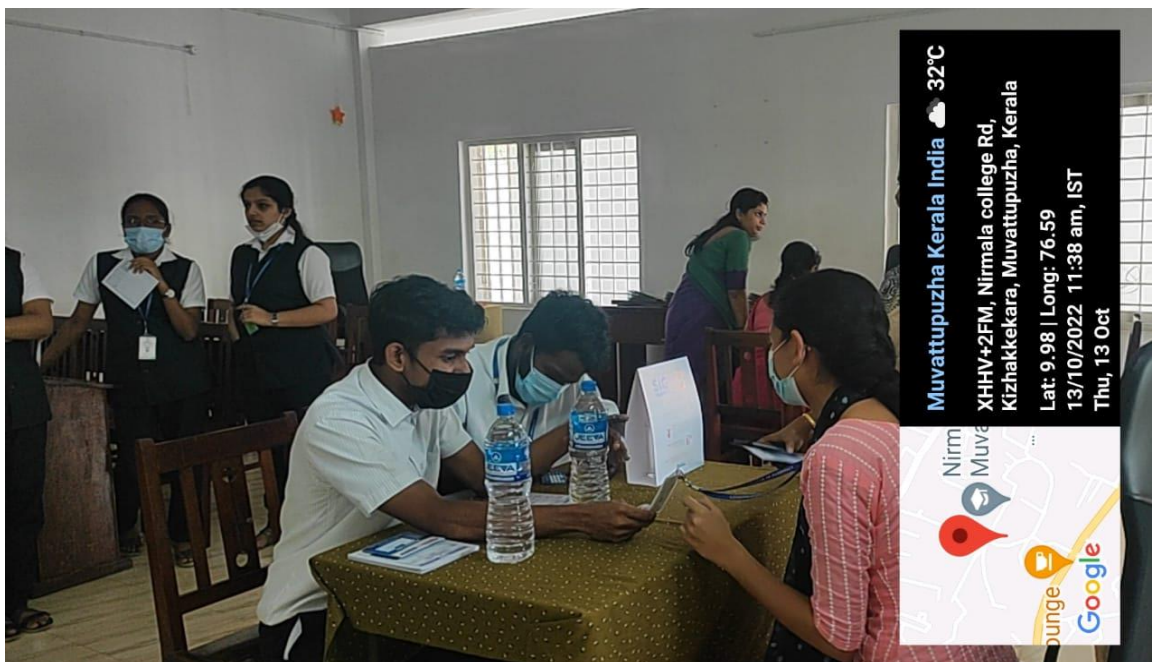


WORLD EYE SIGHT DAY 2022

Staff and students welfare committee in association with ISPOR organized a one day oral hygiene and dental check up camp in Nirmala college of pharmacy campus on 27/09/2019 from 9.00 am to 4 pm. Annoor dental college staffs are invited for the programmed to help us with medical expertise. We had the service of 10 doctors 2 nurses and fully equipped mobile dental clinic. 344 people had attended the camp. Those attendees are from students and public. The service provided includes basic oral health check up and counseling for better oral health. Dental cleaning and dental carries filling were also provided at free of cost those who are advised after the doctor's check up. In an overall discussion doctors concluded that all though oral hygiene of the population enrolled for the camp was satisfactory, oral strains and dental carries are noted. Its mainly due to the high intake of tea, coffee and other carbonated drinks. Small exhibition was also conducted to educate the public with preventive measures to avoid common dental disease.
